

Wesley Pilgrimage in England 8-18 July 2019

Date	Place	Details
8 July Monday	Salisbury Moderate walking, 1-2 miles	Gather at Sarum College at 1:00 pm for lunch in the refectory, followed by an orientation session in the Cavell Room. Steve Manskar and Paul Chilcote will lead a walking tour of Salisbury that includes a visit to Salisbury Methodist Church. Paul Chilcote will lead the first teaching session after supper.
9 July Tuesday	Oxford Moderate walking, 3-4 miles	The day begins with our first service of morning prayer with Eucharist. After breakfast the group boards a coach for the 90 minute ride to Oxford. We'll spend the day exploring the places where the "first rise of Methodism" emerged: Christ Church, Lincoln College, St. Mary's Church, etc.
10 July Wednesday	Salisbury	Morning teaching sessions with free time in the afternoon. This will be a great opportunity to explore Salisbury and Salisbury Cathedral.
11 July Thursday	Travel to Hayes Conference Centre	The group will travel north to the Hayes Conference Centre in Swanwick. We will stop to visit the boyhood home of Bishop Francis Asbury in West Bromwich. One of the highlights of the day will be a lecture on "Mission-shaped Discipleship" Dr. Phil Meadows. Pilgrims will spend the night at Hayes.
12 July Friday	Epworth Moderate walking, 2-3 miles	Pilgrims will explore Epworth, the boyhood home of John and Charles Wesley. They will visit the Old Rectory where they lived, St. Andrew's Church where Samuel Wesley served as Rector for 35 years, the market cross, and Wesley Memorial Methodist Church. After a full day in Epworth, the group will return to Sarum College.
13 July Saturday	Salisbury	This will be a relaxing day of morning teaching sessions and free time in the afternoon. Pilgrims may visit Stonehenge and Old Sarum, and explore market day in Salisbury.
14 July Sunday	Salisbury & Bath	Pilgrims will worship with the people of Salisbury Methodist Church, a congregation established as a Methodist Society in 1757 by John Wesley and served by Francis Asbury before he departed for America. After a traditional English roast, pilgrims may spend the afternoon in Bath.
15 July Monday	Bristol	Pilgrims visit the home of Methodism as movement at the New Room, the oldest Methodist meeting house in the world. They will also visit the Charles Wesley House, where Charles raised his family and wrote many of his hymns.
16 July Tuesday	London Moderate walking	Pilgrims visit John Wesley's Chapel and house, where Methodism as institution was established. After a walking tour of important Wesley/Methodist related sites, including the Aldersgate Memorial Monument, the group will worship at St. Paul's Cathedral's Evensong. Pilgrims return to Sarum College.
17 July Wednesday	Salisbury	We'll having final teaching, Q & A in the morning. The afternoon will be free to give pilgrims time to prepare for their return home. The day will end with closing worship and a banquet in the Sarum College refectory.
